## 1. Big Rock Candy Mountain (by Burl Ives, 1909-1995)

Burl Ives was an itinerant singer and banjoist who became a film actor, author and voice-over artist. He won an Oscar and Golden Globe for his role as Rufus Hannassey in *The Big Country* in 1958 and starred in *East of Eden* and *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof* (also in the Broadway production of 1955). In the 1960s he became a star of country music.

#### 2. Sweet Child O' Mine (by Guns N' Roses)

Guns N' Roses formed in 1985 in LA, comprising vocalist Axl Rose, lead guitarist Slash, rhythm guitarist Izzy Stradlin, bassist Duff McKagan, and drummer Steven Adler. Sweet Child O' Mine comes from their debut album 'Appetite for Destruction' (1987), which also included hits such as Paradise City and Welcome to the Jungle. Guns N' Roses were at the centre of the 80s heavy metal movement, and the band was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in December 2011. <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Guns N%27 Roses">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Guns N%27 Roses</a>

#### 3. Hey Jude (by The Beatles)

This was released as a non-album single in 1968 and credited to the Lennon-McCartney partnership. It evolved from a ballad Paul used to sing to Julian (Jules) Lennon at the time of his parents' divorce and was the first Beatles song to be recorded on eight-track recording equipment. Very simple in structure, the verse uses only 3 chords: F, Bb, C (I, IV, V) – the three-chord trick – and substitutes Eb for C in the chorus.
