Summary of Role:

This is an exciting opportunity to join a thriving Theology department in a school where the subject is part of the core curriculum. We are a friendly, collaborative department who work with dedication to ensure that students are inspired with a passion for Theology, through the curriculum, academic societies and co-curricular opportunities. You will be a well-qualified and inspiring teacher with outstanding subject knowledge and a successful track record of teaching Theology/Religious Studies at Key Stage 3, GCSE and A-Level. You will have experience of using a range of teaching and learning strategies including the use of Microsoft Office suite.

There is plenty of opportunity to use your skills, enthusiasm and creativity to help shape the curriculum as we continue to introduce the Catholic Education Service Religious Education Directory across Key Stage 3. At Key Stage 4 the focus is on Catholic Christianity and Judaism. For the right candidate there may be opportunity to take a lead on the continued development of our curriculum at Key Stage 3 or the redevelopment of our Key Stage 4 curriculum. We follow OCR Religious Studies at A Level, with each teacher delivering one component of the course based on their interest and specialism. Experience of teaching Developments in Christian Thought or Religious Ethics would be an advantage. All students in the Sixth Form follow a General RE programme. This contemporary course encourages students to explore the diverse religious, philosophical, spiritual and non-religious responses to the world in relation to understandings of the human person.

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The girls' commitment to Theology at Woldingham is well above average and they achieve high grades in public examinations year on year. In most years, a number of girls go on to degree courses in Theology, Philosophy and related subjects, and our department has an excellent record of Oxbridge success. There is an expectation of involvement in the range of department competitions, co-curricular clubs and trips.

The Theology department works closely with the Chaplaincy Team, supporting the prayer and liturgical life of the school. This includes preparing students for Anglican and Catholic confirmation, days of reflection and other religious events celebrated by the school. As a teacher of Theology in a Catholic School you will be expected to actively promote our Catholic Ethos and supporting students and wider community in the living out of the Sacred Heart Goals.

Our facilities and resources for teaching Theology are excellent; there is a dedicated suite of classrooms with a departmental office. The department has an excellent subject library in its dedicated Sixth Form teaching room. T This post provides an excellent opportunity for an ECT or current teacher of Theology to work in a school where you will be well supported in your professional development and ambitions.
